







Park Hyatt


Located on the top floors of the 492 meter high 101 floor-high Shanghai World Financial Center, which is also known as the 'Vertical Complex City', the Park Hyatt Shanghai towers above the Lujiazui business district in Pudong. Designed by Tony Chi, the hotel radiates an exclusive ambiance. From its dramatic entrance hall on the ground floor up to the reception on floor 87 and the Sky Residence on the 93rd floor, the hotel offers the perfect setting for business travelers and vacationers. On the 85th floor, the hotel offers its guests a water temple and an infinity pool next to a Tai-Chi square and a wellness studio. The Sky Residence on the 93rd floor is the world's highest restaurant and event venue. Each of the 174 guestrooms and suites of the hotel offers a panoramic view of the Huangpu river and Pudong.













Natural Organic Space

The central body line and the horizontal active line on the ichnography separate the ground floor into a few main areas; in one half is the living room and in the other half a bedroom. The designers did not want any obstacles to obscure the view from the public area and tried to expand the vision of this area to its ultimate size. The doorway extends to the end of the hallway in order to combine with the dining area and move its extension to connect with the kitchen. The lower side of the television wall in the living room is left with an open hole, a breathing tunnel in the visual prospect that connects the living room with the study area in the master bedroom.
